Cleaning and washing fees will not be charged if the renter is willing to perform these duties. Security deposit will be fully refunded if no damage is done to the center and the improvements.

The Executive Committee also approved a special rate for members. A \$50.00 fee will be charged for the use of the center and kitchen facilities including dishes and cutlery. Cleaning and security deposit are as stated above.

Mar Aprem of India

There was a time when Church of the East was the dominant christian church throughout Asia. Its missionaries originating from Bet-Nahrain and Persia had reached India, Siberia, China and even Japan. Its churches, schools and monasteries studded the entire continent. Those who professed its faith and sung her glory were of many races and languages. Alas! today that glorious enterprise has been reduced to a skeleton accepted by few of its founders, the Assyrians.

Besides Assyrians, the only other remaining adherents of the church are a few thousand Indians in the state of Kerala, South India. To the western world these faithful children of the first christian church are known as St. Thomas Christians. Since St. Thomas brought christianity to this part of the world, Assyrian bishops have been assigned to manage the Indian church.

At present, the church is under the learned leadership of Mar Aprem, the first Indian Metropolitan. Dr. Mar Aprem was born George Mookan in June 1940. Educated in India, England and at Princeton University, U.S.A., he was consecrated as Bishop and Metropolitan in Baghdad in September 1968. He holds two master degrees in theology and obtained his Doctor of Theology degree from the University of Serampore, India.

Mar Aprem is active in ecumenical and evangelistic activities. As an orator and writer he is in constant demand inside and outside of his own denomination. The Church of India has been splintered over the years and plagued with strife. We believe that Mar Aprem will finally bring peace and order to his church.

What is of great significance to Assyrians is the fact that Mar Aprem is the only active writer producing books on history, personalities and theology of the Church of the East.

Recently he visited the United States and many Assyrians had the opportunity to meet him. His simplicity, knowledge and dedication to his faith are truly impressive.

William Ibrahimi

The premature death of Honorable William Ibrahimi, the first Assyrian representative in the Iranian parliament is a severe loss to the Assyrians at large. His death at the age of 58 was due to a heart failure.

The following biography is taken from the Persian section of the Assyrian newspaper "ATUR". Mr. Ibrahimi was born in the city of Urmia in 1920. His father, Dr. Schmoel Ibrahimi was a well known physician and received many honors and citations from the government of Iran for services rendered to his country. Mr. Ibrahimi was a teacher by profession and continued his services with the ministry of education in Tehran all his life.

He was an ardent believer in the Assyrian cause and very active in the Assyrian community affairs and organizations. In 1964, when the Iranian government granted the Assyrian minority to select its own representative, Mr. Ibrahimi was elected by a solid majority. He served his people diligently for four years.

In September, 1964 he was invited by the Assyrian American Federation as their guest of honor at the national convention held in Chicago. Mr. Ibrahimi visited the Assyrian communities in California. The Assyrian foundation was co-sponsor of a dinner party in his honor and presented him with a check for \$500 as our contribution to the Assyrian Shooshan School in Tehran.

We of the Assyrian Foundation deeply regret his untimely death and take this opportunity to extend our sincere condolences to his family and the Assyrian Community in Iran.

Avimalk Oraham

Mr. Avimalk Yonan Oraham of London, England died Monday, January 23, 1978 in his home of heart failure. His sudden death at the age of 55 was a shock to his family, relatives and numerous friends throughout the world.

Mr. Oraham and his family settled in London in 1969 after a successful business career in Baghdad where he was born and spent most of his life. Survivors include his wife Najeeba, three sons, two daughters, one brother, four sisters and literally hundreds of cousins among the Gangachin clan.

Mr. Oraham was a dedicated Assyrian who participated actively in Assyrian organizations. He was president of the Assyrian Society of Great Britain and very instrumental in acquiring a center for the Assyrian community in London. He was also an active member of the Assyrian Universal Alliance. His kind heart, humble and helping self will be missed by all those who were fortunate to have known him.

Sargon David

The sudden and tragic death of Sargon David shocked the entire Assyrian Community in the Bay Area. We of the Assyrian Foundation of America extend our sympathy to his family and pray that the Almighty shower upon them strength and understanding to endure this truly heavy burden.

Assyrian Bible

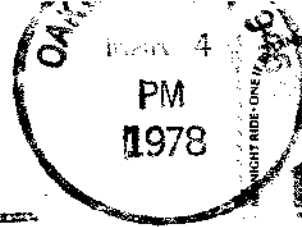
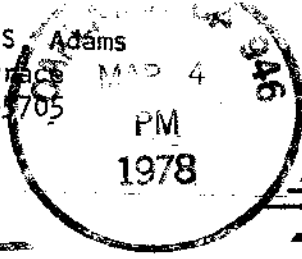
